RE: The crash of One-Two-Go Flight OG 269 in Phuket.

Honorable Prime Minister:

We are writing this letter to draw your attention to the investigation of the air crash of Orient Thai's One-Two-Go flight OG 269 in Phuket on September 16, 2007.

According to credible documents, television interviews and statements available on the Internet, Orient Thai/One-Two-Go pilots are alleging serious illegalities by Mr. Udom Tantiprasongchai, the chairman of Orient Thai and One-Two-Go Airlines. The pilots claim Mr. Tantiprasongchai **regularly and personally** engaged in questionable activities that tragically led to a highly foreseeable crash.

According to these allegations:

- Mr. Tantiprasongchai personally encouraged Orient Thai/One-Two-Go pilots to fly unsafe airplanes.
- Mr. Tantiprasongchai paid bonuses to Orient Thai/One-Two-Go pilots for exceeding legal maximum flying hours, and encouraged other unsafe behaviors.
- **Mr. Tantiprasongchai bribed Department of Civil Aviation (DCA) authorities to overlook these improper activities.**

If any of these allegations is true, clearly Mr. Tantiprasongchai is guilty of criminal conduct and, should that be the case, Mr. Tantiprasongchai must be prosecuted.

Honorable Prime Minister, after the crash of Flight OG 269 resulting in 90 deaths, only an independent and transparent investigation by authorities can allay the fears and suspicions caused by allegations of illegal actions on the part of Udom Tantiprasongchai. Please set our fears and suspicions to rest so that we may all feel comfortable and safe in your beautiful country again.
